

Situation of Human Rights in Colombia and its relationship with the Police Function

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ABSTRACT

The following document is based on the analysis of primary, secondary and tertiary sources available for the issue of human rights, a direct element based on decision-making is related to analysis III quarter 2021 procedure 1IP-PR-0006 monitoring of alleged behaviors that violate rights human rights, when monitoring cases of alleged anomalies or human rights violations according to the report on human rights complaints and processes 3 quarter 2021, trends and risk factors are identified for the National Police where behavior is impacted, by relying on official sources from the Attorney General's Office, the Internal Affairs Office of the General Inspectorate and service areas.

RESUMEN

toma de decisiones se relaciona con el análisis III trimestre 2021 del procedimiento 1IP-PR-0006 de monitoreo de presuntas conductas violatorias de derechos humanos, al monitorear los casos de presuntas anomalías o violaciones a los derechos humanos de acuerdo al informe de quejas y procesos de derechos humanos 3 trimestre 2021, se identifican las tendencias y factores de riesgo para la Policía Nacional donde se impactan las conductas, al apoyarse en fuentes oficiales de la Procuraduría General de la República, la Dirección de Asuntos Internos de la Inspectoría General y las áreas de servicio.

Introducción

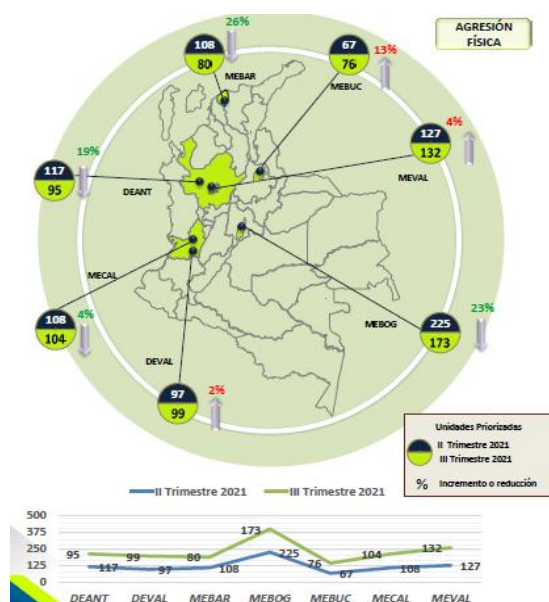
According to the results on the trends of the processes on human rights and IHL, it is found that the behaviors from the evidentiary stage, or the investigation stage, establish that the abuse of authority by the arbitrary and unfair act, has led to validation what is the impact of the valuation in each action, but from the abuse of the public function, as denoted in the results in departments such as Antioquia, Boyacá, Caldas, Huila, Magdalena, Santander, Valle del Cauca, facilitate that the behaviors of abuse of authority by the arbitrary act, abuse of public function, causing damage to the integrity of persons or property, illegal use of public force, illegally depriving a person of liberty.

The statistical information provided in the report GS-2021-021085 of the area of attention and service to the citizen with the application of the PQR for its value on how to achieve a violation of development where the behaviors of physical aggression and arbitrary retention presented by the attention of the phenomena that decrease from 21% (73 cases) where it goes from 813 cases to 640 going from 24 to 26 study cases, a scenario that leads to consider that the best educational practices

correlate that the value of the functionality of the uniformed establishes how its bet is based on appropriate behaviors for its development.

Departments such as San Andrés and Providencia, Guaviare, Choco, Guainía, and Sucre, show that the cases increase due to the dynamics of their populations, which, however, establishes the regular value of the modalities and their criteria.

Espinosa Herrera, (2017), When dynamics associated with the concepts of how human rights applied in the Colombian National Police are systematized, this relationship between the models and cases applied in the police leads to recognition what are the procedures and treatments necessary for police action under the pandemic, social phenomena influenced by the development of models of organized violence were addressed, which by a protocol manner had a purpose on how it would be affected.

Materials and methods

For Espinosa, (2020), the effect is not that the uniformed men withdraw from the causes, but rather that it is interpreted as the consolidation of a social strategy that

coexists mutually in the face of each interest, in the work on how the increase in crime has been the deficit of uniformed personnel on the streets, as a result, the retirement of approximately 9,000 uniformed personnel for completing their stipulated time for the retirement assignment. (Crónica del Quindío, 2019) this is not a consequence of how to address a country's situation that is experienced due to these disturbances.

However, Salgado, & Prieto (2016), the role of the police officer in the post-conflict stage, and strengthened by the social phenomena of the pandemic, significantly addresses how the transformation in the way of training is updated. and trains the uniformed, each action manages to account for the needs on which the concept of mediation is addressed that particularizes the so-called Institutional transformation has carried out a series of strategies to meet these needs and thus improve the service, the creation of the surveillance service of the police officers who provide their administrative services, including the distribution by quadrants that manages to emphasize the context and its requirements (Cuéllar, 2021).

The recognition of the uniformed officers who, after providing active service, expand their service in other roles with units for the police service, as an aspect of citizen attention, where the services provided are internal and external, but they are focused on each unit that strengthens the commitment of police that understands social reality, but with the duty to enforce the rules and not allow any attack on the institutions. For Vergel Vergel, J., Martínez Valdés, R., & Gómez Torres, M. (2017), legitimate limits are proposed on how force is applied, but it is also recognized as the new image that institutional change invites to establish new mechanisms of community visibility, recognizing the weaknesses of the joint work of the force by the National Police of Colombia, which makes it competitive worldwide.

For Suarez, M., Contreras, O., & Salamanca, S. (2016), to establish a security and surveillance service model, it is possible to establish how the provision of the police service establishes the parameters and ways to carry out the deployment of how we managed to transform the uniformed to materialize the development of a much more efficient and effective police force.

Results

However, for Rodríguez, Trujillo, & Santofimio (2021), we must evaluate the applied social phenomena 360 degrees, but manages to unify the criteria that propose an application of preventive means to channel the discipline in the National Police, in the face of behaviors that do not transcend or affect the public function, this sociodemographic argument is an added value to the concepts of how the strategic bets of the police can be invigorated.

When the protests are established; the national police safeguard their realization peacefully, but when they turn in a way that threatens citizenship and their healthy coexistence, particular cases that occurred in 2019 are pointed out, which indicate how values are related and isolated or direct events arise to thicken the visibility of police work (Ruiz, 2021) the pandemic increased socio-emotional cases that separate reality and affect the way of acting.

For the institutional structure, the country recognizes in the security councils a bet on the generation of necessary protocols so that the actions that are proposed and that allow georeferencing the concepts of groups outside the law that threaten how the units and problems are a present influence of the ELN and some dissidents of the FARC that discriminately whip our population in the regions, this due to the information provided by intelligence units. (Market, 2021).

How to develop new bets to improve the strategies and deployment of the National Police, how to improve the service called "professionalization of the service, which by strengthening discipline, and improving career conditions and innovation in the elements of the service of the National Police, are the three axes that the armed institution contemplates in its comprehensive transformation plan" if these concepts become a value associated with the interests of the presidency of the republic, it is again promoted as the modernization and change of institutional image facilitates the recognition of new models.

With the planned modification of the disciplinary regime of the National Police, such is the case that international human rights principles will be incorporated into the disciplinary statute, including those of the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights (IACHR), where the integral transformation of the National Police, are aimed at strengthening the capacities and the police profession to achieve effective crime prevention and control.

However, for Méndez, J. E. R., Aguja, F. A. P., & Quintero, J. L. C. (2021), police education can frame the added value of people who, by internalizing associated problems, constitute decision-making elements where the strategies aimed at are consolidated to systemic and positional change, this argument establishes that the moments of application of knowledge in human rights force the strategic planning of the same applied model.

With the commitment to a new identity of the National Police, in the first place is the new uniform for women and men of the police surveillance model in urban environments (cities and municipalities) seeks to ensure greater visibility of the service and, therefore better identification of the police in attending to citizen requirements following international standards. (Policía Nacional, 2021). The most important thing is the implementation of cameras in police procedures; in an accessory way, it seeks great relevance that the uniforms will have incorporated body cameras or 'bodycam' to transmit in real-time the procedures the police perform. These devices will be activated automatically when the officer has to use his firearm or Taser device to protect people's lives; a process that will be supervised by the Automatic Dispatch Centers (CAD) that will have the simultaneous image from the place where the procedure is carried out. In the same way, the new motto of the National Police refers is "It is an honor to be a police officer" this phrase is implemented with the innovation model of the National Police which allows us to feel proud of our actions without expecting anything in return. In the performance of their duty, only the improvement of the security conditions of society through a relevant police service. Aware that their actions are based on fairness, legality, and the highest pillars of their profession. (Bedoya, 2021).

It is important to carry out a consolidation that identifies the synergies of common learning communities to invite people to react to the model applied for development

purposes, according to Ante, F. G., Aguja, F. P., Villanueva, R. G., & Rojas, L. S. (2022), by inviting researchers to consolidate strategies for change and application of the model turning around the problem, it is possible to access the development of said applications where the evaluative moments with which the process is granted are established.

Conclusion

When the issue of applying human rights in police work has a foundation associated with social, political, economic, legal, and ethical factors, mechanisms must be provided, such as the application of technological tools to safeguard and unify performance criteria and good practices, it always will be faced with how to react to the violent and how their unjustified causes attack institutions or citizens, it is for the fundamental reason to identify which causes are those that provide a log, knowledge management is a fundamental element to incorporate the new competencies and identity based on strengthening police practice. In conclusion, police action is due to an institutional mechanism that seeks to safeguard the citizen but guarantee human dignity however, in a country plagued by violence, with prejudices about uniform action, where the media tend to make events visible that are associated with these realities, the police institution must shield its realization with the management of experiences in the field.

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
